ALCMAN FR. 106 AGAIN

To the passages cited by me (in this journal, 113 [1990] 406) as illustration of the oracular tone in Fείπατέ μοι τάδε, φῦλα βροτήσια, should be added [Plato] Clitoph. 407b1 ποῖ φέρεσθε, ἄνθρωποι; Socrates speaking ἄσπερ ἐπὶ μηχανῆς τραγικῆς θεός ~ Alcman speaking ἄσπερ θεὸς τῶν ἀπὸ μηχανῆς according to Alcus Aristides before he quotes the poet. Perhaps, then, in the platonic passage (407a8), read ἀπὸ for ἐπὶ, a common corruption: see Johansen and Whittle on Aesch. Suppl. 909.
